

# Changing Demographics: Latinos now represent 40% of California's total population


CALIFORNIA'S POPULATION BY RACE/ETHNICITY, 1990-2020

K-12 ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY: 1990 – 2013



UCR has largely kept pace with this trend, growing Latino enrollment from 10% to 35%


UCR'S UNDERGRADUATE PROFILE BY RACE/ETHNICITY: 1990-2013

These students are mostly low income and/or first generation college students


FALL 2014 CALIFORNIA FRESHMAN ADMITTED PROFILE

UCR is successful at graduating these diverse and economically disadvantaged students because we invest in them




However, if the trend of declining State funding per student continues, both quality and access is in peril

- In the last 8 years, the number of **Latino HS graduates who completed the A-G requirements, has almost doubled** from 31,000 (2004) to 58,000 (2012)
